Chapter Spotlight Hillsboro High School FCCLA



The Hillsboro High School FCCLA Chapter is making a meaningful impact by addressing a serious issue affecting our youth: distracted driving. Through their innovative use of the FCCLA National Program, Families Acting for Community Traffic Safety (FACTS), they empowered students to make safer choices behind the wheel.

Their weeklong Distracted Driving Awareness Week was a standout initiative, featuring daily announcements over the intercom sharing impactful statistics and facts to raise awareness schoolwide. Throughout the week, nine dedicated volunteers—including both students and teachers —wore signs highlighting that 9 people die each day from distracted driving in the U.S. This powerful visual served as a constant reminder of the real-life consequences of distracted driving.

The chapter also led engaging, hands-on lessons in Health Education classes, using FACTS program resources to spark conversations about the dangers of distracted driving. During the school's "Hawk Time," Hillsboro FCCLA set up an interactive information booth where students participated in a distracted driving simulation game, gathered educational materials, and took a pledge to drive distraction-free. As a reward, students received a custom-made air freshener with the important reminder: "Phone Down, Buckle Up."
